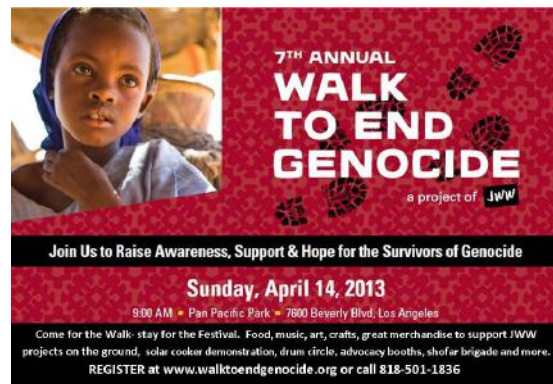

Parshat Tazria-Mezora
Leviticus 12:1-15:32
Rabbi Denise L. Eger

This week's double portion, Tazria-Metora, continues the themes of distinguishing between that which is pure and impure. Last week the foods we eat and are the basis for the laws of kashrut. Not really health but these were rules to help us maintain our spiritual framework we eat.

This week's portions focuses on the spiritual purity and impurity of The Torah goes into detail about how to cleanse a person with a p as well as an ailment of fabric and homes and gives us a formula after childbirth. These ancient understandings of physical affliction rewarding process of childbirth are not really based on scientific understanding of the body.
